Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Why didn't Camp Papillon lease the old SPCA building?

A: The SPCA will currently only lease the building for a short period of time with the possibility of returning to the community in 3 years as they are no longer interested in selling the building. Financially, it would not have been possible to raise enough money to open and operate only to have to relocate 3 years later if the SPCA decides to come back to Monroe County. Camp Papillon members did not want to put their heart & soul into something that could potentially require us to have uproot the animals and start the search for a facility all over again.

Q: Can't AWSOM and Camp Papillon merge into one rescue?

A: Again, we are thinking long term for the sake of the animals. Volunteers of Camp Papillon have, and will continue, to assist AWESOM in the clean up and set up to get the facility open. Camp Papillon Board Members and AWSOM Board Members did meet and discuss the possibility of merging. It was decided that our missions were different and that working together would be a better option and provide a guarantee that animal rescue could still be provided in the future regardless of the decision of the SPCA.

Q: Isn't there an existing building that Camp Papillon can purchase?

A: We are looking at all possibilities that will best suit our needs. Being a 501c3, non-profit, all volunteer agency with a small budget limits our choices. In addition, all properties must be commercially zoned due to our kennel license which also limits location possibilities. The future location of Camp Papillon sanctuary has to be convenient to our coordinators, board members and volunteers who will be running the sanctuary. We are also thinking long term. Camp Papillon currently has almost 100 animals in foster care. We need a space that we will not outgrow as soon as we move in. We need to be able to not only start the sanctuary, but continue to fund it through donations and fundraising events.

Q: What makes Camp Papillon different from the other local shelters?

A: By using foster homes of our experienced volunteers, over the last 6 years Camp Papillon has placed numerous homeless animals, over 600 in the last 3 years alone! We are the largest animal rescue in Monroe County. We are also one of the few groups that do not take animals from outside of Pennsylvania. We are focused on assisting our community with the homeless problem we have here in Monroe County first. Our animals come strictly from foreclosures, abuse & neglect cases, and unwanted animals here from our own backyards. Our wonderful volunteers are tireless in their efforts to house as many animals as possible until they can be placed in their forever homes. We continue to be a no-kill organization and a sanctuary will see to it that no homeless animal ever needs to be euthanized because they weren't adopted.

Q: Why is there a need for a Sanctuary in Monroe County?

A: The need is to simply save lives. Some animals that come to Camp Papillon have medical issues or are older in age. The chance of one of these animals finding their forever home becomes much smaller. The Camp Papillon Sanctuary will provide a home for life for unwanted, unadoptable, sick and old dogs as well as for other animals. Cats, rabbits, ferrets, and any other animal that Camp Papillon can accommodate will be welcomed at our sanctuary.
